BIRMINGHAM, Ala. – July 10, 2017 – The 2017 Innovation Week Birmingham is set for August 18 through August 25 to celebrate innovation in Birmingham by highlighting exciting new technologies and the inventors, investors, entrepreneurs and supporters that drive innovation in the Magic City.

The fourth-annual Innovation Week Birmingham is presented by PNC Bank and sponsored by America's First Federal Credit Union, Protective Life Corp. and Spectrum Enterprise. In previous years, Innovation Week has drawn thousands of people to events across the city, and organizing partners hope this year's Innovation Week will expand its reach further.

Local groups that support Birmingham's innovation ecosystem are encouraged to hold events during the week that highlight and celebrate innovation in Birmingham. - EDPA's Alabama Innovation and Entrepreneurship Conference, with Pulitzer Prize winning columnist, Thomas L. Friedman, as the keynote speaker
- A hackathon hosted by Women Who Code Birmingham

"Innovation Week provides a unique convergence of information technology, cyber-security, digital entertainment, biotechnology and international trade that cuts across Birmingham's public and private sectors," said Jon Nugent, vice president of innovation and technology at the Birmingham Business Alliance. "The breadth and scale of innovation in Birmingham is a differentiating factor for our region. It fuels new products, services and processes, ultimately creating new jobs and improving the standard of living for residents in and around the city. Birmingham is a city of innovators, entrepreneurs, artisans, craftspeople, tradespeople and businesspeople, all of whom share in growing our innovation community and make Birmingham a great place to launch new ventures."

The week will kick off with a ribbon cutting at Innovation Depot on August 18 with regional business leaders and elected officials, followed by a Block Party in downtown Birmingham between The Pizitz and the McWane Science Center.
